### Vocational Service

The opportunity each Rotarian has to represent the dignity and utility of one's vocation to others.

### Community Service

Activities that Rotarians undertake to improve the quality of life in their community. This frequently involves assistance to youth, the aged, the handicapped, and others who look to Rotary as a source of hope for a better life.

### International Service

Programs and activities that Rotarians undertake to advance international understanding, goodwill and peace.

International Service projects are designed to meet humanitarian needs of people in many lands.

### The Four Way Test

Of the things we think, say or do:

- First: Is it the TRUTH?
- Second: Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- Third: Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- Fourth: Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

### FIRST,

*The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;*

### SECOND,

*High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;*

### THIRD,

*The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life;*

### FOURTH,

*The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.*

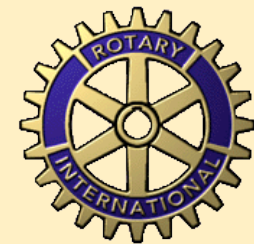
